demonstrating commitment to our shared values

- In 2012, the UW ranked No. 2 in U.S. Peace Corps volunteers, with 110 alumni serving around the world.
- More than 5,300 UW undergraduates spent more than 520,000 hours in volunteerism.
- UW Medicine cares for nearly 1.4 million patients a year through Harborview Medical Center, UW Medical Center, Northwest Hospital and seven UW Medicine Neighborhood clinics. This includes 60% of the hospital charity care in King County and one-third statewide.
- With a goal of advancing excellence at every level of public education, the UW's K-12 Institute pairs local teachers with UW researchers for exciting collaborative projects that bring K-12 students to campus and send UW scientists into schools.

AFFORDABILITY

the Husky Promise®

- The Husky Promise is the University's pledge to cover the cost of tuition for academicallyqualified Washington state students who otherwise could not afford to attend.
- In 2011, nearly 8,500 students will be covered under the Husky Promise over 25% of our undergraduates qualify for this program

HUSKY ATHLETICS

a positive force on and off the field

- There are nearly 650 student athletes in the UW's 21 Division I men's and women's teams.
- The Husky Athletics program relies solely on private funding. It supports more than 2,500 jobs, generates \$211 million in annual sales by Washington businesses, and creates \$83 million annually.

for the enrichment of our region

- More than 200,000 visits to campus for cultural events hosted by the UW performance venues and museums every year. This includes more than 280 performances, 60 exhibits and 100 public programs annually.
- The UW Libraries system is one of the largest research libraries in North America with collections exceeding 7.7 million books and journals and more than 120,000 currently received journals and serial titles.

UW IMPACTS ON THE STATE AND BEYOND

proud to contribute to the vitality of our state*

- In 2009, the UW's overall economic impact on the state of Washington was more than \$9 billion.
- For every \$1.00 the state of Washington invests in the UW, the UW returns more than \$1.48 back to the state in tax revenue and \$22.00 back into the state's economy.
- The UW is the third-largest employer in Washington state, following Boeing and Microsoft driving nearly 70,000 jobs in our state—28,000 at the UW and 42,000 more throughout the state's economy.
- The UW has been the top public university in federal research funding every year since 1974 and among the top five universities, public and private, in federal funding since 1969.
- Nearly 75% of UW graduates remain in Washington after graduation, thus providing the state a well-educated workforce and positively contributing to the state's economy.
